Fund Name	Criteria
Adam Liepinis Memorial Scholarship	Established by the family of the late Adam Liepinis to provide tuition assistance to a graduating senior from a Susquehanna or Wyoming counties school, who will attend a post-secondary degree program with priority given to a student majoring in welding or automotive technology.

**Audrey R. and J. Melvin Kelly
Memorial Scholarship**

Established by the family of Mrs. Kelly to provide tuition assistance for graduating Seniors from Susquehanna County who will attend college or a post-secondary degree program. If a 2.5 GPA is maintained for each year of college the award will continue to be provided.

**Borislav Dumitrov Memorial
Scholarship**

Provided to a student who will enter trade school or a post-secondary degree program.

Cindi Conaty Memorial Scholarship

Established by Jason Legg, in honor of his mother. Provides a post-secondary scholarship to a high school graduate who writes a winning 500 word essay explaining his or her pro-life stance and values and how those values have had an impact upon the student's life. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

Cody Albert Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of Cody Albert. Provides a post-secondary scholarship to a high school graduate who will be majoring in Visual Arts, Psychology or Physical Therapy and who writes a winning essay explaining how anxiety, depression or other adversity has been overcome without resorting to drugs or alcohol as a crutch. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

Daniel Reese Price, Sr. Memorial Scholarship

Established by Daniel and Carolyn Price in memory of his father who was a successful businessman with many skills, the scholarship will be awarded annually to a graduating senior from Forest City Regional High School who has the highest GPA among students who will enroll in a two or four year college, university, or trade school majoring in a trade.

Gil Depew Memorial Scholarship

In memory of Gil Depew, who was diabetic. Provides two post-secondary scholarships to high school graduates who is diabetic, or who has a parent grandparent or sibling with diabetes. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

Helen Whitehead Memorial Scholarship

Provided to a student Senior from Blue Ridge, Elk Lake, Forest City, Montrose, Mountain View or Susquehanna Community High School who will matriculate at a college or post-secondary degree program to major in the culinary profession OR a student who will matriculate at a college or post-secondary degree program to major in a degree in Nursing.

Katherine Davies Price Memorial Scholarship

Established by Daniel and Carolyn Price in memory of his mother who had great Welsh musical talent, the scholarship will be awarded annually to a graduating senior from Forest City Regional High School who has the highest GPA among students who will enroll in a two or four year college or university to major in the visual or performing arts.

Margaret Stone Music Scholarship Endowment

Established by Mrs. Stone to assist a student who will attend her alma mater of Houghton College to major in music. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

Matthew VanFleet Memorial Automotive Scholarship

Established in memory of Matthew Van Fleet who, at 21 years of age, passed away in an automobile accident. Provides a post-secondary scholarship to a high school graduate who will study automotive, motorcycle, or truck technology and who writes a winning 200-250 word essay addressing the following topics: why pursue training in the automotive field; describe your ultimate vehicle; envision the future of automotive technology, and explain one's favorite recreational activity. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

Meshoppen Creek Scholarship

Established by Reverend Paul and Mrs. Myrtle Carlson. Provides a post-secondary scholarship for a high school graduate, who exhibits promise for their future and who writes a winning essay about their greatest accomplishment in life, so far. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

Michelle Hawley TEACH THE CHILDREN Scholarship

Established in memory of Michelle Hawley to provide college tuition assistance to a Blue Ridge, Elk Lake, Forest City, Montrose, Mountain View or Susquehanna Community High School graduate who will major in Elementary Education.

Montrose Area Chamber of Commerce Pauline MacNeal Memorial Scholarship

Established by The Montrose Area Chamber of Commerce. Provides a post-secondary scholarship to a high school graduate who will major in business or a related field and who writes a winning essay of approximately 200 words explaining life goals and expectations upon graduating from college. Scholarship is contingent upon student earning at least a 3.0 GPA during the first semester of college. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

**R.E.S.C.U.E. Benjamin B. Stone
Memorial Scholarship**

Established by the staunch environmental organization “Return Susquehanna County Under Ecology” to recognize Benjamin’s courageous and life-long efforts that both halted threatening pollution to our region and established the Susquehanna County Recycling Center. Provides two post-secondary scholarships to high school graduates who write a winning essay addressing his or her past environmental interests and accomplishments and describing future plans to protect the environment. The delegated selection committee is responsible for selecting the recipient in consultation with The Community Foundation.

**Susquehanna Beekeepers Association
College Scholarship**

Established by the Susquehanna Beekeepers Association to provide college tuition assistance to students from northeastern Pennsylvania who will major in agriculture or biology and who write a winning essay about their experience as a beekeeper.

**Susquehanna County Township
Officials Association Scholarship**

Established by The Susquehanna County Township Supervisors Association to provide a college scholarship to a graduating senior from Susquehanna County who will major in governmental affairs or political science.

**Van Cott Family Memorial
Scholarship**

Established in memory of Kermit Van Cott and his son Forrest to provide tuition assistance to a graduating Senior from one of the High Schools in Susquehanna County, with priority given to Blue Ridge, who will major in Landscape Architecture, Environmental Science, Environmental Engineering, Horticulture, Botany, Forestry, or Agriculture and who will matriculate at college or a post-secondary degree program.
